






# **Local Information**



#### Venue

# Getting to and around Gothenburg

Gothenburg is Sweden's second-largest city and a well-connected destination by air, rail, and road. Here's how to get here - and get around - with ease.



### **X** By Air

Gothenburg Landvetter Airport (GOT) is the main international airport, located about 25 minutes from the city center. It offers direct flights from major European hubs such as Frankfurt, Amsterdam, London, Paris, and Copenhagen.

### Airport to City Center:

• The <u>Flygbussarna</u> airport coach runs every 15–30 minutes and takes approximately 25–30 minutes to Gothenburg Central Station ("Nils Ericson Terminal"). Tickets can be bought online or at machines in the terminal. Search for "Göteborg C" as the end stop.

#### Taxi:

• Fixed-price taxis to the city center cost around 500–600 SEK (companies like <u>Taxi</u> <u>Göteborg</u> or <u>Sverigetaxi</u>). <u>Uber</u> and <u>Bolt</u> ride-hailing services are also available at lower rates.

## By Train

Gothenburg is well-connected by train, particularly within Sweden and to neighboring countries. All trains arrive at Gothenburg Central Station, which is a key public transport hub.

### **≔** Getting to Chalmers

The main Chalmers campus is centrally located and easily accessible by public transport.

- From the Central Station (Nils Ericson Terminal):
  - Take tram line 7 in the direction of "Tynnered"
  - Get off at the Chalmers stop (about 10-15 minutes)
- From Nordstan (close to the Central Station):
  - Take tram line 6 in the direction of "Kortedala via Sahlgrenska" or bus line 16 in the direction of "Marklandsgatan"
  - o Get off at the Chalmers stop (about 20 and 10 minutes, respectively)

#### Tickets:

Public transportation in Gothenburg is operated by <u>Västtrafik</u>. For most local travel, you'll need a **Zone A** ticket, which is valid for **90 minutes** and allows **unlimited transfers** between trams, buses, and ferries within that time.

The easiest way to plan your trip and purchase tickets is via the <u>Västtrafik To Go app</u>, available for both iOS and Android. The app allows you to search routes, view departure times in real-time, and buy tickets directly.

Alternatively, you can use a contactless credit or debit card to pay on board - simply tap your card on the reader as you board a tram, bus, or ferry.



Please note: Tickets must always be purchased **before boarding** unless you're paying with a contactless card.

### By Foot or Bike

If you're staying in the city center, Chalmers is often within walking or biking distance. Gothenburg is a bike-friendly city with rentals available via <a href="Styr & Ställ">Styr & Ställ</a>.

### **Tour to Grimeton Radio Station - June 17**

On Jun 17, 2025, we invite participants to join an organized tour to the <u>Grimeton Radio</u> <u>Station</u>, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the most remarkable feats of early wireless communication technology.

Located just outside Varberg on Sweden's west coast, Grimeton is home to a fully operational longwave transmitter from the 1920s - one of the few surviving examples of pre-electronic radio technology.

- Transport: Buses will be arranged to take participants to and from Grimeton.
- Departure and return times will be communicated closer to the event.
- The tour will include a guided visit, technical insights, and the opportunity to witness a live Transmitter Startup, where skilled operators bring the historic Alexanderson transmitter to life.

# **Practical tips for visiting Sweden**

### Language

- Most Swedes speak excellent English.
- All signs, transport apps, and hotel services are available in English.

### **Currency & payments**

- Sweden uses the Swedish krona (SEK), not the Euro.
- Sweden is a nearly cashless society. Credit/debit cards are accepted everywhere, including taxis.
- Some places do not accept cash at all have a card or mobile payment app ready (e.g., Apple Pay, Google Pay).

### **Tipping**

- Tipping is not mandatory. Rounding up the bill or adding ~5–10% is appreciated in restaurants, but not expected.
- No tipping is needed for taxis or cafés.

### Recycling & sustainability

- Sweden is known for eco-friendly living. You'll find separate bins for paper, plastic, food waste, etc.
- Tap water is safe and excellent feel free to bring a refillable bottle.
